KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS THAT I, Rudolph (Rudy) V. Martin, a citizen and resident of Greenville County, South Carolina, in consideration of the sum of One and No/100 (\$1.00) Dollar and other valuable consideration to me in hand paid, have made, constituted and appointed, and by these presents do make, constitute and appoint Betty J.
