Included within the above described property is a thirty (30') foot right-of-way of the Charleston & Western Carolina (C.&W.C.) Railway, and this conveyance is made subject to such right-of-way. The original established right-of-way of said Railway was Two Hundred (200') feet in width, One Hundred (100') feet of which was with subject premises. Said Railway, by deed dated December 11, 1950, recorded in the RMC Office of Greenville County in Deed Book 427 at Page 277, quit-claimed to the owner of subject property at that time all of the Railway's right, title and interest in and to the seventy (70') foot strip which constitutes the difference between the original 100 foot right-of-way and the present 30 foot right-of-way.

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
