

The roadways, and walks which are the property of the corporation are to be used as means of ingress and egress to and from the lots and visitors and lot owners are to use no other means of ingress or egress.

All persons visiting any lot shall respect the solemnity of the cemetery and no foul noise, or disorderly conduct shall be permitted upon any road, walk, park, parkway, or any portion of the cemetery.

A visitor shall touch nothing in the cemetery that does not belong to him.

Visitors to Graceland Cemetery who are not members of a funeral procession, are required, not to intrude upon a funeral or to loiter about an open grave.

Entrance to and exit from the cemetery by vehicle or otherwise shall be by way of the regular established entrance or driveway.

Vehicles shall not pass a funeral procession, nor shall the funeral be delayed or joined by persons who are stragglers. It is not an occasion for idle curiosity.

Vehicles are not to turn around upon any of the roads, but should follow one of the regular driveways to their objective.

They shall keep on the right and when they stop shall be at least six inches from the right.

4. RAILROAD GROUNDS AND MONUMENTS.

Visitors shall lawfully only in that part of this cemetery destined for same by the Corporation and only upon receiving permission from the duly authorized officers of the Corporation, and under the supervision of the Superintendent, the rail vault must be furnished with shovels having handles allowing interment to be performed safely and securely.

Monuments and rail vaults and other parts of vaults above ground shall be of machine granite, or other stone at least six inches from the right.

No improvements shall be made on any lot without the consent of the Corporation, and only upon receiving permission from the duly authorized officers of the Corporation, and under the supervision of the Superintendent, the rail vault must be furnished with shovels having handles allowing interment to be performed safely and securely.

Monuments shall be placed above ground level, except when permission is granted by the cemetery authority at a price to be set by it.

All work in connection with the laying of foundations of the cemetery shall be done by the employees of the Corporation, and under the supervision of the Superintendent.

No foundation shall be laid until the cost of same has been paid for in cash.

No individual marker or headstone shall be placed above ground level, except when permission is granted by the cemetery authority at a price to be set by it.

All monuments placed in restricted sections of this cemetery shall conform to the following dimensions: Four and six inches minimum base nine feet, maximum height sixteen feet.

Eight and ten feet above base three feet, maximum height including base sixteen feet.

Northern section of Section 5 is restricted to Section 3 and the Southern section of Section 5 is restricted to Section 4.

No family memorial may be erected unless the lot owner

has monument privileges.

No monument will be allowed in the cemetery.

b. PROPERTY AND CARE.

This Corporation agrees to set aside

in a trust fund the sum of \$1,000.

This trust fund is to be received after November 1, 1947.

This trust fund is to be used to provide annual care and

obligation of the Corporation for such annual care.

The funds available from such trust fund,

to the Graceland Cemetery will be expended annually in the cemetery for the repair or damage to monuments, headstones, carvings and other stones which have been removed from the cemetery.

No firearms, refreshments, or intoxicating liquors,

shall at any time be brought upon any lot or

any portion of the cemetery, provided, however, that firearms may be used and discharged in case of a military funeral or on a regular appointed Memorial Day or other patriotic service.

No bird or animal shall be killed, wounded, or

trapped upon, nor shall any animal or the eggs of any

representatives or employees, shall have the right to enter the said lot and remove the said trees or shrubs or such parts thereof as they shall determine to be detrimental, unsightly, or inconvenient. No owner shall be permitted

to put any covering such as crushed stone or foreign substance, on any grave or lot. No coping or other means of marking boundaries of lots or graves can be used except corner stones as provided. No sign indicating a lot or vault is "For Sale" will be permitted in the cemetery grounds.

No improvement shall be made or monument erected, or structure erected and no object or inscription shall be used or placed in or upon any lot without the consent of the Corporation.

No work of any character will be done upon any lot except by cemetery employees or by some person authorized in its behalf, and no lawns, trees, shrubbery, structures, improvements, enclosures, or excavations shall be built, placed or dug upon any lot except by the cemetery employees as directed by the Superintendent.

The grade of all lots, lawns, and avenues as established, or changed, from time to time, by the cemetery shall be altered or changed except by the cemetery.

No trees, shrubbery, or plants shall be placed upon or removed from any lot or buried, except with the consent of the Corporation, but the Corporation shall have the right, from time to time, to plant, transplant, remove, or otherwise, including the right of removal, when it becomes necessary to do so.

Trees will not be removed to make additional burial spaces.

The Corporation reserves to itself the entire control of every tree, shrub, or vine, growing within the cemetery enclosure, whether planted by the lot owner or otherwise, including the right of removal when it becomes necessary to do so.

No flowers or ornaments or objects shall be kept upon any lot other than the same shall have become weathered, soiled, or unsightly, and in case of the failure of the owner of the Corporation to remove any such flowers or other unsightly objects, the Corporation shall have the right to remove the same and in no case will the employees attempt to find them after removal, nor will the Corporation be responsible for damage either to persons or property resulting from falling trees or parts of trees.

No baskets, glass, crockery, wire, metal articles, water-pot, flower pots, glass case, covering box containing artificial flowers, or any sort of receptacle for flowers, except such as are sunk below the surface of the lawn for the grave or lot containing an inner apartment which may be lifted out while lowering the said lot, shall be permitted upon any grave or lot and all such as are not sunk below the surface of the lawn, grave or lot, may be removed by the Corporation.

3. RULES FOR VISITORS AT THE CEMETERY.

The cemetery will be open from seven o'clock a. m. to sunset.

No firearms, refreshments, or intoxicating liquors, shall at any time be brought upon any lot or

any portion of the cemetery, provided, however, that firearms may be used and discharged in case of a military funeral or on a regular appointed Memorial Day or other patriotic service.

No bird or animal shall be killed, wounded, or

trapped upon, nor shall any animal or the eggs of any representative or employee, shall have the right to enter the said lot and remove the said trees or shrubs or such parts thereof as they shall determine to be detrimental, unsightly, or inconvenient. No owner shall be permitted

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF GRACELAND CEMETERY DEVELOPMENT CO., INC.

1. RULES GOVERNING CEMETERY LOT OWNERSHIP.

Lots purchased in Graceland Cemetery are conveyed by Warranty Deed to the purchaser for his family and heirs as a burial place forever.

In order that the Corporation may have a correct record of ownership of all lots where a record and conveyance is made, it is required that a record of the conveyance be presented at its office so that a record before any transfer of ownership is made. A fee of \$7.00 will be collected before any transfer of ownership is made on the Corporation's records. The Corporation is governed by its own records as to ownership of lots.

Where a lot is purchased and an extension of time is granted by the Corporation for payment, the Corporation retains ownership of the lot until all charges due it are paid, and the Corporation reserves the right to remove the remains which may be interred on the lot, to a smaller lot equal in value to the amount paid on the original, or to a single grave in the event that a default occurs in the agreed payment.

An order in writing is required of the lot owner whenever a grave is to be opened, containing the name, sex and residence of the deceased, and a permit from the Board of Health must be shown the Superintendent of the grounds before interment is made. If interment is to be made in the forenoon, application must be made before 2 o'clock p. m. on the previous day. If in the afternoon, by 3 o'clock a. m. on the same day.

Lot owners shall at once notify the Corporation of any change in his or her post office address or name.

No disinterment shall be allowed except upon order of the Executive Officers of the Corporation, and upon the written order of the owner or owners of the lot, and in every case can only be made under the supervision of the Superintendent.

The Corporation shall have the right at all times to enter upon each and every lot for the purpose of maintenance, cleaning, and policing it.

The Corporation from time to time may lay out or alter such avenues or walks, or make such roads and regulations for the government of the general objects deemed requisite or proper to promote the general welfare of the cemetery.

2. RULES GOVERNING WORK DONE AT CEMETERY.

All orders for work should be left with the Superintendent and to be paid for in cash before work is done.

No lot owner shall have the right to have shrubs and plants cultivated in any portion of the lot, except upon consent of the Corporation. In the event permission is granted, all work to be done under the direction of the Superintendent and to be paid for in cash before work is done. If any shrubs, plants or trees situated in any lot shall become detrimental to adjacent lots or avenues or unsightly or inconvenient, or interfere with the proper care of the cemetery, the Corporation, by its authorized representatives or employees, shall have the right to enter the said lot and remove the said trees or shrubs or such parts thereof as they shall determine to be detrimental, unsightly, or inconvenient. No owner shall be permitted
