


All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, lying on the northeasterly side of Silver Creek Road and being known and designated as Lot #286 on that certain plat entitled "Map Number 1, Section 1, Sugar Creek", said plat is of record in the Office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County, South Carolina in Plat Book 5-D, at Page 18, and being described according to a more recent plat entitled "Property of Tommy B. Wessinger and Barbara B.
