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and may special assessments upon the property in the condominium will be assessed by the taxing authorities upon each residence owner, and that such assessments will include the assessment value of the residence and of the undivided interest of the residence owner in the common areas.

- A. Any such taxes and special assessment supen the condomistor property that are not so assessed shall be included in the budget of the Association as recurring expenses and shall be paid by the Association as a common expense (and charged to the particular residence owners to which attributable).
- is. Each residence owner is responsible for paying the taxes assessed or levied with respect to such residence owner's residence and undivided interest in the common areas, limited common areas and facilities.
 - XV. AMERICALETS. Condominium documents may be amended as follows:
- A. Declaration. Amendments to this Pecharation shall be adopted as follows:
 - purpose other than in any respect which will affect the rights of any first nortgage holder under any existing mortgage, and related documents which is authorized by this lecturation and the Act, such amendment to be adopted in accordance with the following procedure (or by written amendment signed by all members of the Association, which written amendment shall be in recordable form and recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, South Carolina).
 - (a) Notice of the subject matter of the proposed amendment shall be included in the notice of any meeting at which a proposed amendment is considered.
 - (b) A resolution adopting a proposed emendment may be proposed by either the Board of Directors of the Association or by the membership of the Association and after being proposed and approved by one of such bodies it must be approved by the other. Directors and members not present at the meetings ""considering the amendment may express their approval in



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
