All that piece, parcel or tract of land, lying, being and situate in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, at the intersection of Whitehorse Road and Staunton Bridge Road, shown and delineated on a plat entitled "Survey for Reeves Brothers, Inc.", by Piedmont Engineers, Architects & Planners, dated November 11, 1982, to be recorded herewith, and referred to on said plat as the "Mills Mfg. Co. Cemetery" containing 1.192 acres, more or less.

Said piece, parcel or tract of land was conveyed to The Mills Manufacturing Company, by Aurelia T. Munn and J. R. Ware, by deed dated April 1, 1906, recorded in Deed Book SSS, page 596, R.M.C. Office for Greenville County.
