South Carolina Greenville County August the Seventeenth One thousand Seven hundred and eighty nine, A Deed of conveyance for One hundred and Seventy four acres of land from James Blasingame Esquire to Reuben Coupland acknowledged by the said James Blasingame in open court and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made the Seventeenth day of August in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and eighty nine, and of the Independence of the United States of North America the fourteenth, Between James Blasingame Esquire of Greenville County and State of South Carolina of the one part, and Reuben Coupland of the County and State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that the said James Blasingame for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty pounds Sterling money to him the said James Blasingame in hand paid by the said Reuben Coupland the receipt whereof the said James Blasingame doth hereby acknowledge, he the said James Blasingame hath granted, bargained and sold, aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth grant, bargain, and sell, alien and confirm unto the said Reuben Coupland his heirs and assigns for ever, certain tract or parcel of land containing by computation One hundred and Seventy four acres be the same more or less situate in the County aforesaid on Saluda River, beginning on a Stake on Saluda River and running thence N 85 $^{\circ}$  32' chain to Stake thence NW 44 $^{\circ}$  70' ch. to a Stake on the Original line, thence with the said line SW 20 $^{\circ}$  28' chain to Stake on the River, thence down the meanders of the River to the beginning, bounded on the NW by land surveyed for Robert Hasty, on the west by Saluda River, and on both the other sides by the said tract, it being part of a tract of land containing eighteen hundred acres, granted to the said James Blasingame on the second day of April 1787, under the hand of his Excellency Thomas Pinckney Esquire Governor and commander in chief, ~~the recorder~~ and recorded in the Secretary's Office grant book No. 111 page 186, reference thereto had will more fully appear, and also all trees, woods, timber, waters, commons, common of pasture, pitch commodities, advantages hereditaments, ways, waters, and appurtenances whatsoever to the said meadow or tenement and premises above mentioned belonging or in anywise appertaining and also the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents and services of the said premises and of every part thereof, and also all the estate, right, title, interest, claim and demand whatsoever of him the said James Blasingame of, in and to the said plantation or tract of land of one hundred and Seventy four acres be the same more or less and every part thereof. To have and to hold the said tract of one hundred and Seventy four acres of land and all land singular the premises above mentioned with every part and parcel thereof with the appurtenances unto the said Reuben Coupland his heirs and assigns ~~for ever~~ to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Reuben Coupland his heirs and assigns forever, and the said James Blasingame, for himself and his heirs the said tract of one hundred and Seventy four acres be the same more or less with the appurtenances and every part thereof of against him and his heirs and against all and every other person or persons.
