or less situated in Greenville County on a Branch of Armstrongs Creek  
waters of Saluda River it being part of a Tract of land granted Nicas  
Darnall on the fourth day of July one thousand seven hundred  
Eighty four by his Excellency William Moultrie Esq<sup>r</sup> containing three  
hundred & four acres stretching & bordering Northward by William Mas-  
tins land Eastwardly by Charles Bensons land & Westwardly by Abraham  
Bradleys land & Adam Cantrells & Southwardly by Tottos Woods & Valentine  
Shacke together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments  
& appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident  
or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises be-  
fore mentioned unto the said John Lathram his heirs & assigns for ever  
and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & Administrators to war-  
rant and for ever defend all & singular the said premises unto the said  
John Lathram his heirs & assigns against myself my heirs & against every  
other person whosoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part  
thereof witness my hand seal this 19<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year of our  
Lord 1796 and in the twentieth year of the Independence of the United  
States of America

The following Deed of Conveyance from Labon Oakley to Philip Evans  
being proven before Amb<sup>r</sup> Blackburn Esq<sup>r</sup> by the Oath Josiah Kenne-  
dy was presented & recited this 3<sup>rd</sup> August 1795

This Indenture made this second day of September one thousand seven  
hundred and ninety six in the twentieth year of the Independence of  
the united States of America between Labon Oakley of the County of  
Greenville State of South Carolina of the one part & Philip Evans of the  
County of State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the s<sup>r</sup>. Labon  
Oakley for & in consideration of the sum of fifty pounds sterling money  
to him in hand paid by the s<sup>r</sup>. Philip Evans the receipt whereof the said  
Labon Oakley doth hereby acknowledge he the said Labon Oakley hath  
granted bargained & sold aliened & confirmed by these presents doth grant  
bargain & sell aliened & confirmed unto Philip Evans his heirs & assigns  
for ever, all that Tract of land situate lying on a branch of Saluda & Red  
oak begining on a post oak being George Goodwins corner from thence  
S.E. 20 to a stake from thence N.E. 45 to a pine from thence S.E. 45 to a post  
oak from thence N.W. 11 to a post oak from thence N.W. 65 36 chain to a  
Red oak being Meredith Blackburns corner from thence along Blackburns  
line one chain to a light wood Stake from thence S.E. to the begining con-  
taining one hundred & seventeen acres by the same more or less bounded by  
lands westwardly abut on lands lying South to John Macombs -
