

do sell bargain release and for ever quit claim unto him the said Josiah McKennedy all my equal undivided moiety or half share of the property of the firm aforesaid consisting of four plantations three in the County of Greenville aforesaid and one in the County of Pendleton, four Negroes - Lewis John, Barnett Lucy and also four head of Horses, Two Stitts, and all the stock of every description unto the said firm or copartnership appertaining and belonging to have and to hold unto him the said Josiah McKennedy his heirs and assigns for ever without any let hindrance or molestation whatsoever from me or any person claiming under me, and whereas the said Josiah McKennedy is in the actual possession, this Instrument is intended as a complete relinquishment to all right title to the premises above described from me my heirs and assigns for ever both in law and equity In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety six

The following deed of Conveyance from John Hinson to Josiah McKennedy being proven before Amb. Blackburn Esq<sup>r</sup> by the oath of Joshua Kennedy was presented & recorded this 30<sup>th</sup> Nov<sup>r</sup> 1796 This Instrument made the twenty fourth day of September one thousand seven hundred and ninety six in the twenty first year of the Independency of America between John Hinson of Greenville County and State of South Carolina of the one part, and Josiah McKennedy of the County & State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said John Hinson for the consideration of the sum of Two hundred pounds Sterling money to him in hand paid by the said Josiah McKennedy the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and him the said John Hinson hath bargained sold released and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto Josiah McKennedy his heirs and assigns a tract of land situate lying and being in the County & State aforesaid containing two hundred & five acres (be the some more or less) being part of a tract granted by his Excellency William Moultrie Esq<sup>r</sup> to Capt. Stringer 7<sup>th</sup> day of August 1786 recorded in the Public Office Great Book N. N. N. page 277 Beginning at a black oak on the Bank of Saluda River Georgia
