37. The following Deed of Conveyance from Battle Birdsong to Nicholas Davis  
being proven before Wm. Hutcherson Esq. by the oath of Ephraim Ross  
was presented and Recorded this 21<sup>st</sup> day of April 1797  
This Indenture made this twentieth day of March one thousand seven  
hundred and ninety five and of the Independency of America the  
nineteenth between Battle Birdsong of the one part and Nicholas Davis  
of the other part witnesseth that for and in the consideration of ten  
pounds sterling to the said Birdsong in hand paid therewith whereof he  
acknowledged hath bargained granted and sold and by these presents doth  
grant and sell unto the said Nicholas Davis his heirs  
a piece of land lying on the north side of  
Gilders Creek being part of  
Battle Birdsong in the  
year one thousand seven hun-  
dred and ninety one con-  
taining 1262 acres the parcel of land  
hereby granted is as above represented begining at a stake and running N 20° E  
26.50 to a red oak then as is above plated supposed to contain twenty acres and  
all house ways water claims profits interest titles hereditaments, appur-  
tenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging and hereby granted  
to the said Nicholas Davis his heirs or assigns for ever and the said D. F. the  
Birdsong do by these presents for ever quit claim and grant to J. Davis his heirs
