The following deed of conveyance from <sup>Wm Loge</sup> to  
Nathan Waddell being proven I<sup>o</sup> Tarrant Esq<sup>r</sup>  
by the oath of James Tarrant was presented and recor-  
ded this 10<sup>th</sup> day of Sep 1801

State of Carolina - Know all men by  
these presents that I William Loge of Greenville  
County in the State aforesaid planter in consid-  
eration of the sum of two hundred dollars to me in  
hand paid by Nathan Waddell of Greenville County  
in the state aforesaid workman hath granted  
bargained sold and released unto the said Nathan  
Waddell one certain tract of land containing one  
hundred and thirty five acres & a half to the same  
more or less situate lying and being in Greenville  
County on the east side of Saluda river in the state  
aforesaid being part of a tract of land originally  
granted to Robert Gilliland Esq<sup>r</sup> by his Excellency  
Gen<sup>l</sup> Moutrie Esq<sup>r</sup> & then Governor on the fifth  
day of December in year one thousand seven  
hundred & eighty five and recorded in grant  
Books C. G. C. page 280 & after <sup>by R. Gilliland to</sup> conveyed  
to William Loge beginning on a post oak on  
John Bowens line ~~thence~~ Long the original  
line to which it intersects a line originally run  
David Gentry now ~~run~~ <sup>run</sup> ~~run~~ <sup>run</sup> by Obadiah Wood thence
