Know all men by these presents that William Dough of Laurens County & State for in consideration of the sum of Two hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by ^{Wm} Taylor of Granville County and State aforesaid have granted bargain & sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain & sell release unto the said William Taylor parcel of land containing one hundred acres it being a part of a tract granted certain grant of two hundred acres granted unto Jesse Keys by his Excellency ^{Wm} Moultrie Esq^r dated the 3rd day of April A^d 1786 recorded in grant book K K K K page 83 situate in the District of ninety
