This Indenture made this nineteenth day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and ninety nine between Leo- nard Clayborne of the State of South Carolina Greenville County of the One part and Solomon Forster and Spartanburgh "County" of the other part, witnesseth that the said Leonard Clayborne for & in consideration of the sum of Forty pounds Sterling to him in hand paid the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge, hath bar- gained granted and sold and by these presents doth bargain grant & see and confirm unto the said Solomon Forster a Certain Plantation or tract of Land Containing or supposed to be One hundred acres it being Part of a tract of Land granted from State Office to J. Forster bearing date One thousand seven hundred & eighty seven lying and being in Spartanburgh County & State aforesd, and situate on a bank of Little Creek Creek, beginning at a pine, running thence S. 56 W. to a tree oak thence N. 45 W. 50 to a red oak, thence N. 45 E. 15 to a red oak
