 by a plat annexed to the original grant it being two hundred & fifteen acres Together with all  
 singular the rights, numbers, boundaries & appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any  
 wise incident or appertaining To have and to hold all & singular the premises before mentioned unto  
 the S<sup>d</sup> John Hightower his heirs & assigns forever And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & Administrators  
 to warrant & forever defend all & singular the said premises unto the S<sup>d</sup> John Hightower his heirs &  
 assigns Against myself my heirs & against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or  
 to claim the same or any part thereof In Testimony whereof I have caused to be set my hand &  
 seal this tenth day of December in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight hundred & four  
 and in the twenty ninth year of American Independence Signed sealed & Acknow-  
 ledged in the presence of - Peter Cantrell.)

 planter have granted & bargained this 6<sup>th</sup> day and by these presents do grant & bargain sell & lease  
 unto the S<sup>d</sup> John Clement all that tract or plantation of Land containing three hundred  
 and forty acres Originally granted to James Shirley situated on the Golden River creek in Greenville  
 District in the State aforesaid bounded to the north east on land granted to Francis Goffier  
 and now owned by the S<sup>d</sup> John Bowe & on all other sides by vacant land when surveyed  
 Together with all & singular the rights, numbers, boundaries & appurtenances to the said premises  
 belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining To have and to hold all & singular  
 the premises before mentioned unto the said John Clement his heirs & assigns forever  
 and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & administrators to warrant  
 and power defend all & singular the premises unto the S<sup>d</sup> John Clement his  
 (heirs)
