Have granted bargained sold & released and by these presents Do Grant bargain sell & release unto the s<sup>r</sup> John M. Clannaham one certain Lot. or part of a lot of lands, situate lying & being in the Village of Pleasantburg (at Greenville Courthouse) Known and Distinguished in the plan or chart of said Village by the Number five (5) and being the North end of said Lot. Beginning on a Stake C. Col. Alstone corner running thence N. 15<sup>E</sup> E. 100 feet to a Stake thence S. 74<sup>E</sup> E. 100 feet to a Stake thence S. 15<sup>E</sup> W. 100 feet to Stake N. 74<sup>E</sup> W. 100 feet to the Beginning being part of a lot of lands Conveyed to me by Leml. J. Alston. Together with all and singular the Rights Members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To Have and To Hold — singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John M. Clannaham his heirs & assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John M. Clannaham his heirs & assigns Against myself & my heirs and Against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this Twenty ninth day of March in the year of our Lord one Thousand and Eight hundred and five. Signed Sealed & delivered in the presence of us . . . .
