

This Indenture made the seventh day of November in the year of our Lord one Thousand eight hundred and five and in the twenty ninth year of American Independance, Between William Anderson Sheriff of the District aforesaid, of the one part. and. Patton Ewin and Cleveland of the others part. Whereas Thomas Alexander is seized in fee simple him and his heirs forever a certain house and lot at Greenville. O. house in the Village of Pleasantburg Containing one half acre Situate & bounded as followeth Lot N^o. 36. Beginning on a Stake running thence South 74¹/₂ E. 107¹/₂ feet thence S. 15¹/₂ W. 140 feet to a Stake, thence N. 74¹/₂ W. 117¹/₂ to a Stake thence N. 15¹/₂ E. 140 feet to the Beginning. being on half acre more or less, and whereas James Blackstock did in October Term one thousand Eight hundred and two commence an action of debt in the Court of Common Pleas of Greenville District against the said Thomas Alexander in which Action such proceedings were had in the said Court. that the said James Blackstock did at October term eighteen hundred and two, obtain judgment against the said Thomas Alexander in the Court aforesaid for the sum of one hundred Eighteen and fifty Cents with costs by him expended in behalf of said suit: as by the records of said Court will appear. Impersuance of which judgment there issued from the said Court a writ of fieri facias Testified by the Honorable John T. Grimes Senr. a special Justice of the State aforesaid. in the year eighteen hundred & four. on the 3rd Monday in October directed to all singular the Sheriffs of the State aforesaid
