John Baylis Earle Elkin of the State & District aforesaid in consideration of the sum of one &
Thousand Dollars to me paid by Elias Earle in the State & District aforesaid have granted
bargained sold & released and by these presents do grant bargain sell & Release unto the
said Elias Earle all the several tracts of Land hereafter described (to wit) one tract or parcel
of Land laying on the waters of Armstrongs Creek a branch of Saluda including Jacob Reasonover
and his fathers Plantation containing two hundred & nineteen acres as fr. deed from Jacob
Reasonover to said Elkins reference to the said deed will make it more fully appear dated the 8th day
of November 1802. one other tract or parcel of lands adjoining the above & including part of S. Reasonovers
plantation & containing one hundred & thirty two acres as by deed from Joseph Reasonover to said
Elkins will more fully appear bearing date the 8th day of November 1805. one other tract or parcel of
land adjoining the above & including John Reasonovers plantation & conveyed from Reasonover to said
Elkins by a deed bearing date the 8th of November 1802 laying on the waters of Peedy River
and Armstrongs Cr. of Saluda, & one other tract or parcel of lands purchased of Stephen L. Wood
containing one hundred & fifty acres & being the place where Benjamin Elkin now lives & known by the
name of the sign of the white horse & adjoining the above lands purchased of Reasonover as by
reference to deeds from Stephen L. Wood to John B. Elkins will more fully appear bearing date
the 5th day of June 1802. Together with all & singular the rights, members & appurtenances
to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, To have and To hold
all & singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Elias Earle his heirs & assigns forever
including all the several tracts or pieces of lands as before described. And I do hereby bind my-
-self my heirs Executors & administrators to warrant & save defend all the several plantations or
tracts of lands containing 54 hundred and thirty three acres as before described, with all & singular
the said premises unto the said Elias Earle his heirs & assigns, against me & my heirs & all and every
other person or persons whatsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof
