No 5 Page 480 Beginning on a post Oak old marked for said tract and runs N 45° 10' E chains to a pine 34. on thence due west 25° 50' to a post oak 34. now marked on the ancient boundary line thence along said line due North 33° 75' to a stake 34. on thence on a new line through said tract S 64° E 44' chains to the Beginning corner Post Oak which includes the land to be conveyed. Together with all and singular the rights, members, incidentaries, appurtenances to the said Premises Belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all singular the Premises before mentioned do unto the said Thomas Butter his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executory and administrator To warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said Thomas Butter his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against every Person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. No 5 page 480 situate in the State & District aforesaid on both sides of Gray branch Waters of Guineas (Ruck)
