Carolina, Greenville District, I know all men by these presents that I Jepse Cobb of the district and State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Thomas Tarrant of the district and State aforesaid at and before the Sealing and Delivering of these presents, Hath granted bargained sold let leased and Conformed unto the said Thomas Tarrant all that plantation or tract of land Situated lying and being in the district aforesaid, on Saluda River, and its branches, containing one hundred and fifty acres, be the same more or less, begining at the fence of Larkin Tarrants on the bank of Saluda river, from thence on S. fence, to the original corner, from thence to a small marked Hickory Station, from thence on a direct line, to the back line, of said land, from thence S. & S.W. on lands of Mary Savel, John Jones and Joseph Wood, thence on a new Conditional line made between Mosley and Paine to the said River, from thence up the meanders of said River, to the Beginning corner, Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, To Have and To hold all all and singular the said premises unto the said Thomas Tarrant, his heirs and assigns forever, I do hereby bind myself my heirs and representatives to warrant and forever defend, all and singular the above bargained premises unto the said Thomas Tarrant, his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs Executors, & against all & every person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 15<sup>th</sup> March eighteen hundred and Six, and the thirty & thirty first years of American Independance. E. 4. thence N. 30. W. 2. thence N. 60. E. 9. & 66. thence S. 30. E. 15. thence S. 60. W. 16. to the said River, Together with all and singular the rights, members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, To have and To hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Armstrong his heirs and assigns forever And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant & forever pay
