

State of South Carolina. Know all men by these presents, that I John Cantrell
of Greenville District in the State aforesaid, for the consideration of one hundred and two
dollars to me in hand well and truly paid by George Shotwell of the State and districts
aforesaid (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) Have Granted bargained & sold, and by
these presents do Grant bargain & sell unto the said George Shotwell all that tract or parcel
of land containing two hundred acres lying and being in the district aforesaid on
the east fork of Saluda river, Joining land of John Lovell William Cooke
and David Morris, Together with the mill thereon, and including the plantation
on which I now live and all the rights, members hereditaments and appurtenances
to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident and belonging —

To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the
said George Shotwell his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself my
heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and Sin-
gular, the said premises unto the said George Shotwell his heirs and assigns
against myself and my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming
or to claim the same or any part thereof. Provided and it is hereby specially agreed
and concluded by the said parties that if the said John Cantrell shall pay or cause
to be paid unto the said George Shotwell the said sum of one hundred and two dollars
the lands and premises above mentioned, shall revert back and become the property
of the said John Cantrell again provided the said money be paid within fifteen days
from this date, any thing said above to the contrary notwithstanding.

of the District and State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars
to me in hand paid by Thomas Stone of S^r district hath given granted bargained sold &
delivered unto said Thomas Stone one certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being
in Greenville District & on the waters of the North fork of Saluda River, Containing fifty acres
but the same more or less, & is bounded as followeth to wit, Beginning on a red oak thence the
various courses that is represented in a deed given by John Rice to Sam^r Moore for the
said plantation or tract of land which said tract of land, I do hereby for myself my heirs
& forever, warrant and defend unto the said Thos. Stone his heirs &c. against the just
claims or claims of any other person or persons whatever, lawfully claiming or to claim
the same or any part thereof.
