 District of S^t C^t aforesaid, have granted bargained sold & released and by these Presents
 Do grant bargain sell & Release unto the said John Stokes all that Piece Parcel
 tract of land Containing two hundred acres be the same more or less situate in Greenville
 District on Laurell creek waters of Reedy river, Beginning on a box oak N^o 65 E⁵⁰ 00
 to a Stake N^o 25 W⁵⁰ 00 thence to a white oak South 55 W⁵⁰ 00 to a black oak
 thence to the Beginning corner, South 25 E⁵⁰ 00. Bounded on all sides by Vacant land when
 laid out or generally granted to Samuel Dunlap deceased & the said Samuel Dunlap
 by his last will & testament did bequeath the said tract of land Containing two
 hundred acres as aforesaid, unto the said Susannah Dunlap & Catharine Dunlap
 now the wife of the said William Dorough to be Equally divided between them
 Susannah Dunlap and Catharine Dunlap the present wife of the said William
 Dorough as by a reference to the last will & Testament will more fully and at
 Large appear. Now the land intended to be conveyed is jointly agreed to be

 forever, and we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant
 and forever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said John Stokes
 his heirs and assigns against ourselves and our heirs & against every person whomsoever
 lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - Witness our hands and
 seals this twenty fourth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and six, and thirty first year of the Independence of the United States
