of the district of Pendleton for the consideration of Two Hundred dollars to me paid  
by Willey S. Brown of Greenville District both of the State aforesaid, have  
granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do bargain  
sell make over, & release unto the said Willey S. Brown all that plantation  
or tract of Land containing by survey seventy three acres be the same more or  
less, lying being in Greenville District on waters of South Sacolett river, Beginning  
at a pine thence W. to a Stake to Gentrys Corner, then in a direct line with  
S<sup>t</sup>. Gentrys Crops fence to the creek thence up meanders of the creek to a branch  
making in on the south side thence south up the branch to a red oak thence N. 70.  
East 12 chains to a Hf. thence E. 26 chains to a chestnut, thence N. 2. E. 21 Ch. to the  
beginning being the lower end of a tract granted to Mr. Lynch by patent bearing  
date 3<sup>rd</sup> June 1786. & by Lynch conveyed to Dr. Hall by him to Royal Pass  
& by him to John Sloan and by him to me, also one other parcel of land adjoining  
the same beginning on a P. oak Willey S. Browns line thence S. 50. to a gum thence  
E. 30. to a red oak thence S. W. 8 to a post oak, thence South 58. W. 29. 50. to a
