 Two hundred Dollars to me paid in hand by said Wilson, have bargained sold and released  
 a certain tract of Land containing two hundred acres more or less, now adjoining lands  
 belonging to James Blackstock S.C. Thompson Dickerson, N.C. David Garrison Adam Caruth  
 S.W. being situate on the Golden Grove Creek and by these presents doth grant  
 bargain sell and release unto the said William Wilson all the aforesaid mentioned  
 tract of Land. Together with all and singular the premises & appurtenances in any  
 wise belonging thereto, unto the said Wilson his heirs and assigns forever. And I  
 do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors administrators to warrant and forever  
 defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Wilson his heirs and  
 assigns, against myself my heirs and against every other person or persons  
 lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, witness my  
 hand and Seal this 26<sup>th</sup> day January in the year of our Lord one thousand  
 Eight hundred and three, Signed Sealed and Delivered in presence of  
 Wm. Smith J.M. Gehee & Jonathan Pinell *Sed*

 my Guardianship of William Brooks son of Barley Brooks Dec'd. in short,  
 that there should be no distress, have bargained sold and made over and by  
 these presents do bargain sell and make over unto the said Sylvanus Walker a certain  
 negro woman named Susanna & her child named Mary also all my household and  
 kitchen furniture also all my plantation utensils. To have and to hold all and  
 singular the above mentioned negroes and property annexed for the safety of the said  
 Sylvanus Walker as my guardianship of the said William Brooks to have and  
 to hold the above mentioned property to only proper use of him the said Sylvanus  
 Walker his heirs Executors adm'ts or assigns forever, and I the said Blaggrave
