State of South Carolina, Greenville District, Know all men by these presents that William Thornton of the State and district aforesaid, have for the consideration of one hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by Nicholas Tally of the state & district aforesaid Have bargained sold and delivered unto him the said Nicholas Tally that plantation or tract of Land whereon Alexander West now lives which contains Ninety Seven acres & having such marks as appears from a plat of the same which was granted to William Flippo on the fifth day of December A.D. 1790. and of the Independency of the United States the fifteenth year which was conveyed to me by Basel B. Smithson which said lands and premises I do hereby for myself and every other person or persons, warrant and forever defend the above said Premises to the said Nicholas Tally his heirs and assigns forever, and I do further warrant and forever defend the above said premises from my heirs Executors or Administrators claiming or to claim any part thereof, where I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the 29th of September in the year of our Lord 1808. & In the 32nd year of the independence of the United States of America — Signed Sealed and Delivered in presence of us Test Wm Ch. McJunkin, Jno. Hand & William Thornton Esq^r his mark

McJunkin and made oath in due form that he saw William Thornton sign seal and deliver the within Instrument of writing to Nicholas Tally and also heard him acknowledge this to be his act and deed of Conveyance for the purposes within mentioned, and that Jonathan Hand was a subscribing witness with himself to the same, Sworn & Subscribed before me this the 30th of September 1808. Griffin his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or plantation of Land containing one hundred and twelve acres situate in the State and District aforesaid on some branches of Rocky Creek water of Enoree River, it being a part of a tract originally granted to Thos Lefire, Beginning on a maple tree on the south side of Rocky creek
