To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Reuben Smith his heirs & assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs and assigns, to warrant the said land from myself my heirs or assigns to all other Persons unto the said Reuben Smith his heirs and assigns forever. The State of South Carolina, Know all men by these presents that I George Ryall of Greenville district and State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Eighty dollars & twenty five cents torn in hand paid by John Archer of the district & state aforesaid. I have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said John Archer all that tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and forty acres, situate lying & being in the district and State aforesaid, on a branch of Brushy Creek water of Enoree river, it being a part of a tract of seven hundred and fifty acres originally given to Thomas Keel & more particularly designated by a line, Beginning on a Poplar corner on the west side of a branch of brushy creek aforesaid running N $^{\circ}$ 80 W $^{\circ}$ 10. to three Chestnut shrubs & thence S $^{\circ}$ 12 W $^{\circ}$ 24 to pine & thence to the original line thence E 22.50 to a stake & thence N 20 E 52 to a red oak & thence N 37 W 53 to a red oak & thence through said tract S 26 W 8.75 to a poplar & thence S 50 W 6.50 to pine & thence S 29 E 16 to a small maple & on said branch thence up the said branch to the beginning poplar, which lines as described include the above one hundred and forty acres contained, Together with all and singular the hereditaments & appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining.
