

These presents doth bargain and sell unto the said William Stone a certain tract or parcel of Land, containing by estimation sixty three acres be the same more or less, situated in the district aforesaid on the waters of Mountain Creek and bounded "as follows." Beginning at a stake on Stone's line, thence S. 10 N. 47. 25 to a post oak, thence N. 43. 6. 47. 25 to a post oak, thence N. 63. W. 26. to the Beginning, which parcel or tract of Land as above described, with all its rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances, I do hereby warrant and forever defend unto the said William Stone, his heirs or adm<sup>r</sup> an indefeasible right and title, or an in fee simple inheritance, against myself and my heirs, and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of June 1810. and in the thirty fourth year of the Independence of the United States of America —

This Indenture made this twenty fourth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and ten, between William Cox of the State and district aforesaid of the one part, and John Cox of the other part. Witnesseth that the said William Cox hath bargained granted and sold for the sum of Two hundred and fifty dollars to him in hand paid by the said John Cox before the signing and delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, to the above John Cox his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation two hundred and fifty acres more or less, situated in the State and district aforesaid being part of a tract of Land, which the said William Cox purchased from Dennis Duff which was originally granted to said Duff in three parcels, "to wit" one hundred and fifty acres granted on the fifth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty six, by his excellency William Moultrie, and Recorded in grant book 20. 20. page 69. and one hundred and twenty four acres granted by his excellency Thomas Pinckney on the seventh day of May in the year of our Lord
