This Indenture made the thirteenth day of December in the 11th year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven and in the twenty third year of American Independence between Silas Brock of the state of N. Carolina and County of Lincoln of the one part and John Hitchen of the County of Greenville & State of South Carolina of the other part. In witnesseth that the said Silas Brock for and in consideration of the sum of ten pounds sterling money to him in hand well and truly paid by the said John Hitchen the Receipt whereof the s. Silas Brock doth hereby acknowledge, He s. Silas Brock hath granted bargained sold aliened confirmed and by these presents Doth grant bargain and sell alien and confirm unto the said John Hitchen his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever, a certain tract or parcel of Land containing one hundred acres more or less situate in Greenville County being and laying south of Rocky creek waters of Enoree River & on both sides of the old boundary Line, Beginning on a stake running W. to a water oak corner, from thence S. to a post oak corner, from thence E. to a red oak corner thence S. 60 E. to a post oak corner from thence S. 12 W. to a post oak corner, from thence to a post oak corner from thence to a gum corner from thence N. to a stake, from thence S. 60 E. to a stake from thence N. to a stake the Beginning corner, Together with all the woods waters & water courses profits Commodities appertences and hereditaments whatsoever thereunto belonging To Have & to Hold the said tract of one hundred acres of Land more or less, all and singular the premises as above mentioned unto the said John Hitchen his heirs and assigns forever, to the only proper use
