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South Carolina. Know all men by these Presents that I John Jordan of Spartanburg District & State aforesaid for and in consideration of five hundred dollars to me in hand paid by James Smith of Greenville District and State aforesaid, have granted bargained sold and released, and by these Presents doth grant bargain sell and release unto the said James Smith that Plantation or Part of Land wherein he now lives, containing two hundred acres to the same more or less lying and being on both sides of the middle fork of Tiger River, begining on a Post Oak on the North side of said river, thence N. 00° 44'.72 crossing said river to a red oak, thence S. 00° 44'.72 to a Stake, thence E. 00° 44'.72 to a Stake, thence N. 00° 44'.72 to the beginning it being granted to John Jordan 1784. Also twenty acres be the same more or less, begining at a red oak, thence South West to a Pine near the head of said Smith's Spring, thence nearly South down the said branch to a Hickory, being a part of a tract of land granted to James Jordan Esq^r. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances, to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James Smith his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby "bind" myself my heirs &c or. and executors to warrant and forever defend the said premises unto the said James Smith his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - Witness my hand and seal this first day of February one thousand eight hundred and twelve -

I do hereby certify unto all whom it may concern that Lucy Jordan the wife of the aforesaid John Jordan did this day come before me, and upon being privately examined by me, did declare that she does freely and voluntarily and without any compulsion dread or fear of any person or persons whomsoever renounce release and forever relinquish unto James Smith his heirs and assigns all her interest and Estate, and also all her right and claim of Dower of in or to all and singular the premises aforesaid mentioned and released - Given under my hand this 16th Day of July 1812.
