

170 State South Carolina Know all men by these Presents that I James Fisher of Greenville District for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to me paid by Joseph King of the dist'ct aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and do by these presents grant bargain sell & release unto the s^r Joseph King a tract or parcel of land in the dist'ct aforesaid on both sides of Mill Creek of S^r Parrott river beginning at a Pine running thence N^E 40 W. to a red Oak thence S^E 50 W. 27 ch. to a Chestnut Stake, thence S^E 40 E. to a small Pine Envys Corner thence thence to the begining containing by estimation one hundred acre, be the same more or less excluding the Hocolling House & most of the Plantation, Together with all and singular the rights, members, hundaments & appurtenances to the said premises, belonging or in any wise appertaining To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Joseph King, And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors or adm^ts to warrant and forever defend "all" and singular the said premises unto the said Joseph King his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs and against every person lawfully claiming or to claim the same in any part thereof In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the ninth day of April 1811 — Signed Sealed and delivered in presence of

Walker, and running N. E. 45° 16.50 to a Hickory corner, thence in a direct square to a Hickory corner on a branch of said Creek, thence up the mandr. of the S. branch to a White Oak at the head of the branch, thence to a Pine corner, thence N. E. 40° 39' to a Stake corner thence S. E. 45° 25' to a branch which was made a Conditional between Samuel & John Wm. thence down said branch to its confluence with the Little Grove Creek from thence down the Little Grove Creek to John Bowens line, land now belonging to Philip Evans, thence N. W. 45° 17' to a corner of Philip Evans land, from thence S.
