State S. Carolina, Greenville District. Know all men by these presents, that I Joseph Walker of the State and district aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of thirty Dollars, to me paid by Joseph Wood of the aforesaid State & district Slave granted bargained sold and released unto the said Joseph Wood and by those present do grant bargain sell and release a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the district aforesaid on the branch of Green creek water of South Pacolet River. Beginning on a stake on a line run up the said Green creek, thence to a forked chestnut, thence S. 85 W. 24 ch. to a chestnut, thence S. 13 W. 7 ch. 50 links to a red oak thence S. 13 E. 20 ch. 80 links to a small (gum Black) thence N. 87 E. 30 ch. to a Locust stake, thence N. 32 E. 8 ch. 75 links to a stake on or near a red oak now in cleared land of said Wood field from thence on a conditional line now marked between him & Jacob Belvoir the purchaser of the other part, the said conditional line to continue to the Beginning stake, Being considered by Estimation one hundred acres be the same more or less this being part of a survey granted by patent to Benjamin Huddleston bearing date 1st October 1798. Together with all and singular the premises above mentioned and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining to the same I have & do hold all and singular the right, members hereditaments & appurtenances to the premises before mentioned. I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and adm'rs to warrant and defend the premises unto the said Joseph Wood his heirs and assigns forever, against me and my heirs and against every person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
