 This Indenture made this twentieth day February in the year of our Lord one thousand and
 eight hundred and one between William Bourland of the County of Pendleton
 and State of South Carolina of the one part and William Thruston of the county
 of Greenville and State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said
 Bourland for and in consideration of the sum of fifty Pounds Sterling
 Money of South Carolina to him in hand paid before the sealing and delivery
 of these presents by him the said William Thruston the receipt whereof the
 P. William Bourland doth hereby acknowledge & himself herewith fully satis-
 fied and of every part and part thereof doth hereby acquit and discharge
 the said William Thruston and his heirs forever hath granted bargained
 sold & conveyed, and by these presents doth fully clearly and absolutely grant
 bargain sell and convey to him the said William Thruston his heirs and
 assigns forever a certain piece or parcel of land in the County of Greenville
 on the north side of Saluda River Beginning at Beach on the bank of the River
 in a line laid off for Solomon Murphree running with said line to a post oak
 corner Wm Griffins Turnpike running with said line to a red oak corner unto
 a red oak corner in Wm Thackers line thence with said line to a red oak corner
 in Abram Bradleys line running with said line to a stake corner in William
 Thrustons line running with said line to Saluda River thence running down the
 River keeping the meander of the same to the Beginning including three
 hundred acres be the same more or less to have & hold forever the said
 grant and bargained premises with all the appurtenances & privileges thereto
 belonging or in any wise appertaining to him the said William Thruston his
 heirs and assigns forever to his and their only proper use forever and the said
 William Bourland for himself his heirs &c & administrators doth covenant and
 agree to and with said William Thruston his heirs and assigns that he may
 at all times forever hereafter lawfully & peaceably possess and enjoy the aforesaid
 land with all the appurtenances free & clear of all incumbrancy & claim whatsoever
 and the said William Bourland and his heirs the aforesaid land with the appurte-
 nances unto him the said William Thruston his heirs and assigns against all and
 every person or persons whatsoever will well and truly and forever defend by these
