And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Henry Middleton, his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

We trust, my hand and seal this 28th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen and in the thirty eighth of the Independence of the United States of America.
