The State of South Carolina. Whereas the late James Kilgore in his lifetime  
did execute a penal Bond bearing date 3<sup>rd</sup> day of January 1812 where in  
he bound himself his heirs Executors and Administrators to make unto Parshall  
and Richard Smithson their heirs Executors Adm<sup>r</sup>s or Assigns a good  
and lawful right or title to a certain plantation or tract of land there  
described so that we his lawful Executors do fulfil the same Know all men  
by these present that we the Executors of the Estate of James Kilgore dec<sup>d</sup>  
(namely Andrew McCrary Henry Brockman and Jeremiah Kilgore) of  
Greenville District and state aforesaid and in consideration of the sum  
of Eighteen Hundred Dollars to us paid by Parshall Smithson of the  
state and District aforesaid we have granted bargained and sold and by these  
presents do grant Bargain sell and convey unto the sd Parshall Smithson  
his heirs and Assigns for ever all that tract or plantation of Land supposed  
to contain four Hundred acres be the same more or less two Hundred acres  
of which were originally granted to John Peck the 6<sup>th</sup> day of February 1786  
and recorded in grant book 16. 16. 16. 16 - <sup>the one a part of a tract</sup> The balance being part of two tracts of six  
Hundred & forty acres originally granted to John Mitchell the 19<sup>th</sup> day of March  
1787, and recorded in grant Book 11. 11. 11. 11 page 42 and conveyed by s<sup>r</sup> Mitchell  
to s<sup>r</sup> Dacus 29<sup>th</sup> October 1803 and from s<sup>r</sup> Dacus to James Kilgore the 18<sup>th</sup>  
day Jan<sup>y</sup> 1812 the remainder being part of a tract of four hundred and  
thirty one acres conveyed from Joshua Owen to James Kilgore the 3<sup>rd</sup> day  
of May 1806 Situate on both side of Gilders Creek waters of Cowee river  
including the plantation wherein John Dacus sen<sup>r</sup> and son formerly lived also  
Griss mill and all the appertanances thereto belonging beginning at a  
Sweet Gum tree for John Mitchell then on Andrew McCrary's line S. 35 E. 55  
to a Pine 3+, thence S. 15 W. 26 to a P. 3+ on the south side of Austin's wag  
gon Road thence up the mander s<sup>r</sup> Road to Nathan Dacus' line thence  
Southward on s<sup>r</sup> line to Gilders Creek, thence down the mander of s<sup>r</sup> Creek to  
an old line made for John Peck, thence on s<sup>r</sup> line S. 15 E. 50 a Stake 3+ on  
thence S. 72 E. 23<sup>rd</sup> to a P. 3+ on Arch<sup>rd</sup> Lester's line thence on s<sup>r</sup> line S. 11 E.  
50 to a P. 3+ on north side of the Court house road, thence N. W. on s<sup>r</sup> Road to a  
fork near the corner of Daniel Breacham's fence, thence on an old road northward  
to Daniel Breacham's Red Oak corner then on s<sup>r</sup> Breacham's line No. 66 E.
