Greenville district, it being originally granted to John Timmons
and by him conveyed to Francis Howell and by the said Howell conveyed
to the said David Goodlett, together with the Mill Stone, that are there
now lying, with all the right interest or claim I might or could have by any
reservation heretofore made by me in a deed that I made to Alex^r Maddell
to have and to hold all and singular the aforesaid mill seat unto the said
Henry Middleton his heirs or assigns; against myself my heirs & forever.
