The State of South Carolina. Know all men by these presents that I Lemuel  
J. Atston of Greenville distric and State aforesaid in consideration of Ten  
Dollars to me in hand paid by Scott Earle of the distric and State  
aforesaid. Have granted bargained sold and released, and by these  
presents do grant bargain sell and Release unto the said George W.  
Earle two lots of land containing one acre more or less situated in  
the village at Greenville Courthouse known and distinguished in the plan  
or chart of said village by the number forty nine and fifty (49 & 50)  
lying North of David Hennings lot, Beginning at a Stake on the E.  
side of Main Street at said Hennings corner thence S<sup>o</sup> 74<sup>z</sup> E 35 2<sup>z</sup> feet  
to a Stake N<sup>o</sup> 15<sup>z</sup> E 100 feet to a Stake thence N 74<sup>z</sup> W 35 2<sup>z</sup> feet  
to a Stake, thence S<sup>o</sup> 15<sup>z</sup> W 100 feet to the Beginning. Together with  
all and singular the Rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances  
to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining  
to Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned  
unto the said Geo. W. Earle his heirs and assigns, forever and I  
do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to  
Warrant and force defend all and singular the said property  
unto the said Geo. W. Earle his heirs and assigns against myself  
and my heirs and against every other person whomsoever lawfully  
claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - Witness my  
hand and seal this 14<sup>th</sup> day of September in the year of our  
Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen. Signed sealed
