The State of South Carolina, Know all men by these presents that I Samuel Earle of the district of Pendleton in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of four thousand dollars to me paid by Baylis John Earle, my eldest son, have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell & release unto the said Baylis John Earle all that Plantation or tract of land situate in the district of Greenville in the State aforesaid, on the South fork of Saluda River, containing six hundred and thirty six acres, having the boundaries lines and courses following, to wit Beginning on a Box elder on the northern bank of said South fork of Saluda, thence North 15 East 23 chains 50 links to a Post Oak, thence North 45 West 10 chains to a red Oak thence North 38 West 10 chains to a red Oak, thence <sup>40</sup> on the Waggon Road leading to it thence by thence along said road to a red oak, thence North 1
