This Indenture made this 18th day of April in Year one thousand eight hundred and ten, between Martin Conner of Greenville district and State of South Carolina of the one part, and John Steed of the same district and State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Martin Conner for & in consideration of the just sum of four hundred dollars to him paid by the said John Steed the receipt whereof the said Martin Conner doth hereby acknowledge, & hath granted bargained & sold, & by these Presents doth bargain & sell unto the sd John Steed his Heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract of land, situate lying & being in the district aforesd on the parting ridge between the waters of Enoree & reedy river, Containing one hundred acres of land more or less, & bounded as follows, viz, begining on a red oak corner bounded on either side by Bates land, thence along the original line an East course to a conditional corner made on a gum between Moses Bates and Martin Conner, thence along the sd line to Moses Bates old line, thence along the s^d line a South course to a red oak corner, thence a West course to a fork of a branch, thence along said branch to a Persimmon tree, thence a West course, a conditional line made between Andrew Cooksey and Enoch Cooksey to a black Jack corner, then a straight line a North course to a Chestnut corner, thence down a branch to a fork, thence up the fork to the head of the branch on a Pine corner made between Martin Conner and John Bates, thence North to a Lightwood corner at the edge of the old field, thence the conditional line to a lightwood corner of John Bates,
