This Indenture Made this Sixteenth day of February AD  
1818 in the forty second year of American Independance  
Between Frederick Hawkins of the State of South Carolina  
and Greenville District of the one part & John Hawkins  
of the State & County of the Other part Witne  
Eth whereas in & by a certain Grant bearing date the  
Twenty first day of January 1785 from under his Excellency  
Benjamin Guerard Esquire Governor did give & grant unto  
William Young a tract of one hundred & seventy four acres  
of Land situate in Greenville District on a branch of Red  
River Near Parises Mountain West of the ascent of the R. Young  
by a Deed of Conveyance did grant unto the said Frederick  
Hawkins on the Second day of August A.D. 1794 and the  
S<sup>r</sup> Frederick Hawkins hath bargained & sold unto the S<sup>r</sup>  
John Hawkins all that tract of Land containing one Hundred  
& seventy four Acres be Same more or less Beginning at a  
P. Oak N. 58 E. 25.00 to a Chesnut N. 27. W. 50.00 R. Oak  
S 58. W. 35.00 R. Oak S. 27. E. 50.00 P. Oak N. 63 E. 11.00  
= for S. 80 E. 12.50 P. Oak N. 58 E. 24 For the S<sup>r</sup> Frederick  
Hawkins for & in Consideration of the Sum of four  
Hundred Dollars to him in hand paid by the S<sup>r</sup> John  
Hawkins the Right Whereof is hereby Acknowledged hath  
Sold & Delivered & by these presents doth grant to the said  
John Hawkins his heirs & assigns forever with all houses  
fields Woods Watters & Water courses Fruit Trees & every  
Other advantage of said premises To have & to Hold the said  
Tract of Land containing one Hundred & seventy four Acres  
be the Same more or less & that the S<sup>r</sup> Frederick his heirs and  
assigns shall forever Warrant & Defend (According to Law)  
the S<sup>r</sup> Tract of Land to John Hawkins his heirs & that the S<sup>r</sup>  
Frederick Hawkins do forever Warrant & Defend from all  
Persons & manner of persons whatsoever unto the S<sup>r</sup> John Hawkins
