South Carolina To all to whom these presents shall come, I Thomas Payne, Sheriff  
of Greenville district, and State aforesaid, send Greeting: Whereas by virtue  
of an order which issued out of the Court of common Pleas held for the said district  
titled the 31<sup>st</sup> day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight  
hundred and fourteen, and the suit of William Duvall (one of the Heirs of John  
Nations deceased) against Catharine Nations the Widow by a writ of  
Partition, which order directed that I should on the first Monday in December  
then next ensuing, after having given lawful notice thereof, proceed to sell the land  
of John Nations Dec<sup>d</sup> agreeable to the return of the commissioners upon a writ  
of twelve months: pursuant to the direction, of the act of assembly: in obedience to  
the said order I have seized and taken of the lands of the said John Nations a  
tract of one hundred and ninety one acres, more or less, Situate in Greenville  
district, originally granted unto James Harrison, on Reedy river beginning on a  
gun, running thence N.W. 20 to Gilliam Corner a post Oak, thence N.E. 70 seven &  
a half chains to a Post Oak Corner, from thence N.W. 30 a direct straight course to  
Hudsons Stake Corner, near a large branch on the north side of said branch  
from thence N.E. along Duvalls line with the courses to reedy river from  
thence down the said river with the meanders so far as will intersect with a  
line originally made for William Hogan thence N.W. 66 to the corner, thence  
S.W. 24 to a large branch from thence up s<sup>d</sup> branch with the meanders to the  
beginning, as may appear by a deed convey the same from Noman Hudson  
to Thomas Crowder. And Whereas, the said premises with their appurtenances  
since the seizure by me made by virtue of the said order of Court ~~before~~ before  
mentioned, have been exposed to Sale at public vendue and purchased by Eli  
Baldwin of the district of Greenville for the sum of two hundred and ten dollars,  
that price or sum being the highest sum that was bidder therefor: Now know  
Ye that I the said Thomas Payne Sheriff aforesaid, by virtue of the said order of Court  
aforesaid, to me directed and delivered as aforesaid, and by virtue of the Statute in  
such case made and provided, and for and in consideration of the said sum of  
two hundred and ten dollars, to me in hand paid or secured to be paid, by the said  
Eli Baldwin, the receipt and payment whereof, I do hereby acknowledge, have  
granted bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto  
the said Eli Baldwin his heirs and assigns forever, the said tract piece or parcel  
of land with its appurtenances, and all the estate right title and interest, which  
the said John Nations, or his heirs of right had of, in and to the same: To have  
and to hold the said piece parcel and tract of land with its appurtenances  
unto the said Eli Baldwin his heirs and assigns forever, as fully and absolutely as I the said  
Thomas Payne might could or ought to grant, bargain & sell the same, by virtue of the  
Statute aforesaid, and the said order of Court or otherwise. In Witness whereof I the said Thomas  
Payne have hereunto set my Hand & Seal the 2<sup>d</sup> day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand
