branches of horse creek waters of Reedy River. Beginning on a red oak
Sapling 3x three \$35 C^h 29. 50 lbs to a stake 3x bounding on the S^d William
Jones land three \$70% w^t q^o to stump 3x three at 22 W^t 17. 50 to a
stake 3x three at 6 W^t 10 to the beginning bounding on the S^d Joseph
Mc Collough. Together with all and singular the rights, members
incidents, and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in
any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular
the premises before mentioned unto the said Jo^s Mc Collough his heirs & assigns
forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & adms^t
