State of South Carolina; Know all men by these presents that I William Goldsmith of the state aforesaid and district of Greenville for & in consider-  
ation of four hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Abner Jones of  
the state & district aforesaid. I have granted bargained and sold &  
by these presents do grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Abner  
Jones his heirs and assigns a certain plantation or tract of land contain-  
ning Four hundred acres lying and being in the district of Greenville  
on the South side of Darbin creek. Beginning at a stake corner of the  
tract running thence 65° E 31 ch. 25 links to a stake 3 & thence N 35°  
to the said Darbin creek thence up said creek to where it crosses the  
old line thence along said line to McLain's line thence along said line to  
Steel's stake corner running thence S 20° E 60 ch. 50 lk to a stake S 70° E to a stake thence N 54 E 67°  
15 links to a stake thence N 12 E to a stake thence N W to a stake  
which includes the land to be conveyed, being a certain tract of land  
anted to William Steel bearing date the 5 September 1785 recorded in  
Court Book EEEE Page 337 signed by his excellency W. Moultrie Esq.  
then Governor over said state. Together with all and singular the right,  
members, hereditaments, & appurtenances thereto belonging or in any  
wise incident or appertaining to the same unto the said Abner Jones,  
his heirs executors, adm'rs or assigns the premises above mentioned. And  
I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executors, administrators or assigns  
to warrant and defend the premises above mentioned, from myself,  
my heirs or assigns or any other person or persons lawfully claiming  
the same or any part thereof unto the aforesaid Abner Jones his heirs &  
assigns forever. Witness my hand and seal this 20 April 1808. and the  
3<sup>d</sup> year of the Independence of the United States of America.

do hereby certify to all whom it may concern that Elizabeth Goldsmith the  
wife of the within named Mr Goldsmith did this day come before me & upon being

without any compulsion, dread or fear of any person or persons whomsoever  
aforesee, release & forego relinquish unto the within named Abner Jones  
all her interest and estate also all her right & claim of dower of in and
