aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Sarah
Dill, a tract or plantation of land laying and being in the district
aforesaid, on both sides of Blazingame's mill creek. Beginning at
a chestnut Blazingame corner, thence with his line N. 65 W 16 chs
50 lds to a hickory, thence S. 22 W 10 chs. 50 lds to a pine thence S. 35
W 14 chs to a post oak, thence N. 75 W 46 chs to a hickory thence N. 30
W 2 chs to a stake on Johnson's line, thence with his line N. 7 W 5 chs
50 lds to a Post oak, near the Tapto road, thence N. 82 E along the
road 19 chs 38 lds to a chestnut, thence N. 69 E 15 chs to a post oak
thence N. 57 E 7 chs to a gum bush near the creek thence N. 70 E 10 chs
to a Post oak, thence S. 45 E to the beginning, containing one hundred
