ation of the sum of five hundred dollars, to me
in hand paid, by Sandy Walker, of the same distri-
ct and state, have bargained sold and released
and by these presents do bargain sell and release
unto the said Sandy Walker a negro boy named
Dick, thirty five years of age; to have and to
hold the said negro Boy Dick, in full complete
forever — and I do hereby bind my self my
heirs and assigns to warrant and forever defend
the said Sandy Walker in the quiet use and possession
of the said negro boy Dick as aforesaid —

and seal this 30th day of October 1822, in pre-

of three hundred Dollars in hand by said William
Johnson the receipt whereof is here by acknowledged
by the said William King hath bargained and sol.
