situate lying and being in the District aforesaid  
on the Golden Grove creek. The lines and boundaries

said creek thence down the meanders of said  
creek to a willow oak  $\frac{1}{11}$  + on Bowies line, bound-  
ed by land belonging to John Richardson  
and John Westfield, thence running with  
Bowies old line N $45^{\circ}$  W $6^{\circ}$  ch. 74 lin to a Stake  
 $\frac{1}{11}$  + on W. Blasingame's line bounded by land
