Know all men by these presents that I Robert Alexander of the District of Greenville and State aforesaid in consideration of one hundred and fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Cain Wells of the District and State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Cain Wells all that tract or parcel of land situated in Greenville District on the North bank of Puckey River and McWilliams branch Beginning on a persimmon tree on the bank of the River thence N.45.E 14. to a pine thence N.60.E.23.25 to a Black oak thence S.20.East 41.81 to Spanish oak thence S.45.W.24. to a dogwood on the River thence up the meander of the River to the beginning corner on the lower end by Kellys camp as may more fully appear by the annexed plat containing one hundred and thirty three acres more or less together all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appertances to the said premises belonging or in any ways incident or appertaining To Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Cain Wells his heirs and assigns for ever.
