

bargained sold and delivered and by these presents do bargain, sell and deliver unto the said Nimrod Underwood a certain negro fellow called Captain about twenty years of age and purchased by me on the 3rd day 1826 at public auction from the said Nimrod to have and to hold to him and his heirs forever against me and my heirs and every other person whatever provided that if I should pay or cause to be paid unto the said Nimrod on or before the 1st day of Jan'y 1827 the sum of five hundred dollars with the lawful interest thereon from 2nd Jan'y 1826 for which the said Nimrod holds my auto Penal Bond for one thousand dollars with security, and this mortgage is taken as additional and further security for the said sum of money and interest thereon this instrument to be void and of none effect and the said negro fellow Captain of right to belong to me as if this mortgage had been never made and in default thereof to belong to the said Nimrod and his heirs forever and full power is hereby given to the said Nimrod to enter upon any and all my premises and to take the said negro fellow Captain convert him his own use as he may think proper to witness my hand and seal this 4th day of March A.D 1826.

Walker of the district and state aforesaid, do grant bargain sell and convey unto the said Thomas G. Walker one certain tract or parcel of land situate and lying in the state and district aforesaid containing twenty acres more or less and bounded as follows. Beginning on a chestnut oak corner on the original survey running thence N. 20 E. 20 ch to a stake thence N. 70 W. 20 ch to a stake thence S. 25 W. to Stephen Philips line thence to the beginning supposed to contain twenty acres part of a tract of land containing five hundred acres granted to Alexander West by his Excellency Governor John Drayton bearing date the first day of December one thousand eight hundred, and by Alexander West three hundred acres of the above granted were conveyed to Thomas Edward of which the above twenty acres is a part and now conveyed to Thomas G. Walker in fee simple to have and to hold to him and his heirs forever all and singular the said twenty acres more or less with all and singular the incidents hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident from me and my heirs and from every other person whosoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof I bind myself my heirs Executors, administrators, assigns by these presents to warrant and for ever defend the same from me and all others as witness my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen signed sealed and delivered in the presence of
