George Lewis and from George Lewis to Aaron Kump and from said
Kump to Lewis Hamill then sold by Henry Tandy Walker Sheriff of
Greenville to Horatio Griffin and William Brown and by them conveyed
to John J. Bulow together with all and singular the Rights, members
Appurtenances, and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in
