

Said I have granted bargained sold and released and do by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Jeremiah Cleveland all that tract or parcel of land containing fifty acres lie the same more or less situate lying and being in the District and State aforesaid it being part of a two hundred and forty acre tract of land granted to John Stiles, sold and conveyed to John Sparks and this fifty acres taken off by said Sparks and conveyed to the said Jeremiah Cleveland Beginning at a Hickory, thence to a black Oak at the head of a branch that enters into a branch that passes by Thomas Lewis waters of South Tyger River thence a straight line to an ash that stands in said branch that passes by said Lewis thence up the branch to a black oak that stands near the head, thence straight line to a black oak that stands near 3d greys line thence a long sd line to the beginning together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to the said I have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Jeremiah Cleveland his heirs and assigns against my self and my heirs and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this sixteenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight.
