Carolina I know all men by these presents that Grunville District I Samuel Brasher of Pinetleton district and state aforesaid In consideration of two hundred and Sixty dollars to me paid by James Creamer of the state and district aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the so James Creamer a plantation and part of two original tracts one granted to Jacob Winder Janes on the 3^d day of December 1787 then conveyed by him to so Brasher now from so Brasher to so Creamer part of the tract beginning on a small black oak on the original line running an 8th line S 23 W to a black oak then N 15 W 13 ch to a post oak thence 8 65 E to a stake thence N 55 E 23 ch 56 L to a post oak thence N 15 E 1 ch 75 L to Spanish oak then to the beginning including twenty five acres more or less the other tract was granted Robert Gilliam on the seventh day of April 1788
