taining fifty acres more or less, situate on the waters of Eno
River in the State and district aforesaid, beginning on
a Black gum on Stephen Powley line, thence on said line run-
ning nearly S. E. to a chestnut thence to a pine, thence to a red oak
thence to a post oak, thence to a red oak thence to a pine corner
on James Balin line, thence on said J. Balin to a Spanish oak
corner thence running on James Shirley line to red oak thence
to a Hickory thence to a Hickory thence to a small crick or branch
of Eno River thence up the meander of said Branch
to the mouth of the first Branch thence up the meander
of said branch to a poplar thence to hickory thence to a
white oak thence up the meander of Stephen Powley-
